North, South, East, West; these are the Cardinal Directions, immortal points on the compass. In this contemporary pattern, each arm of the Greek cross reaches toward one of Earth's Four Corners, pointing the way to wealth, knowledge and relaxation. Sailors traveled North on high waves to fish the icy waters, South to breathe the balmy air of the Tropics, East to load their ships with profitable trade goods and West to encounter new lands, new dangers, and new opportunities. The compass points guide every ship's journey, showing a path to adventure.




SURF PENDLETON!

PENDLETON AND SURFING -THE FIRST WETSUIT

Before wetsuits, 1950s-era California surfers layered Pendleton shirts and trunks over petroleum jelly to stay warm on the waves. On shore, surfers wore the same Pendleton Board Shirt over khakis—and so, a trend was born.

The Beach Boys were part of the craze. Originally called The Pendletones, they wore blue Pendleton Board Shirts on the cover of several records and albums, including Surfer Girl and Surfin' Safari. That pattern—now called Original Surf Plaid—is still available. The Majorettes also name-dropped Pendleton in their 1963 hit "White Levis": "My boyfriend's always wearin' white Levi's...his surfin' hat and a big plaid Pendleton shirt."

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



THE HEART OF CRAFT BREW COUNTRY

If you're on a West Coast road trip, be sure to check out ROGUE ALES Brewery in beautiful Newport, Oregon. Known for award-winning ales, the company has taphouses throughout the state. They are the makers of Pendleton Pale Ale, available in cans that celebrate National Parks with Pendleton blanket stripes.

When Brewmaster John Maier set out to make the Pendleton Pale Ale, his #1 goal was to create a highly drinkable summer pale ale. He wanted no up-front bitter, so he decided against tropical fruit hops and went with old-school British Hops. These spicy, woody hops allow the malt to come through. This is a fitting flavor foundation for Pendleton Pale Ale, as the company has deep British roots, thanks to English weaver Thomas Kay, who came to Oregon to found the Pendleton weaving legacy in 1863.

Brewer Michael King explains that it takes three weeks to brew Pendleton Pale Ale. In Michael's opinion, canning the beer creates a distinctive flavor that is remarkably close to draft.





BREWMASTER EXTRAORDINAIRE

John Maier has been brewing for 28 years. His title of Brewmaster has been well-earned through dedication, experimentation, and a craftsman's attention to every detail. He also rides his bike to work every day.

GIFT OF THE EARTH

For over 20 years, Wieden+Kennedy, the American Indian College Fund, and Pendleton Woolen Mills have worked together on a line of blankets to raise money and promote higher education in Native American communities. The newest blanket, Gift of the Earth, is a bold design on a neutral backdrop inspired by traditional Hopi pottery of Arizona. Hopi potters draw from generations of knowledge to create unique works of art. This design honors the practice of learning from the past while moving into


FEATURED ARTIST



Virginia Stroud

Virginia Stroud is an enrolled member of the United Keetoowah Band of Cherokee Indians. She is based in Oklahoma, and her work is shown extensively in museums and galleries worldwide. She received the Cherokee Medal of Honor in 2000. "I paint for my people. Art is a way for our culture to survive...maybe the only way." Her designs for the AICF, "Sons of the Sky" and "Daughters of the Earth," are child-sized blankets that honor a significant Plains Indian tradition: parents place the newborn child's umbilical cord inside a turtle or lizard-shaped amulet that embodies the turtle's hard shell or the lizard's quick movement. This guards the child's spirit to ensure a long, protected life.





PROTECT AND PRESERVE

Pendleton's commitment to the National Park Foundation continues throughout 2017, helping to protect and preserve America's Treasures for generations to come.

A PROJECT COMES TO LIFE AT MANY GLACIER LODGE

Visitors to Glacier National Park are ascending the newly restored Helical Stairs at Many Glacier Lodge. This project was funded in part by Pendleton Woolen Mills, through donations from sales of National Park merchandise from Pendleton and their many collaborative partners. The new stairs are a marvel of both engineering and woodworking!

Pendleton's donations will also help to fund the restoration of the Grand Canyon Train Depot, improving accessibility to the "front door" of Grand Canyon National Park.




